To provide penalties for conduct involving fire alarms and conduct at fires.

BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and board of aldermen of the Town of Elizabeth that:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to give a false fire alarm either through the fire alarm system installed in the town, or by the use of telephones, or by the use of any other device.
- Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, except a person whose duty it is to attend fire alarms, to answer any fire alarm or to race with or follow, any fire apparatus answering any alarm to a fire.
- Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to stop any motor vehicle or to park it within three hundred feet on any street from where there is any fire, other than motor vehicles belonging to persons whose duty it is to attend fires.
- Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any vehicle over any line of hose which has been stretched by the Fire Department.
- Section 5. Upon hearing the approach of any fire apparatus in either direction which is answering a fire alarm, it shall be the duty of any driver of any vehicle immediately to bring his vehicle to a stop on the right side of the street and remain at a stop until the fire apparatus has passed more than two blocks, provided that this section shall not apply to ambulances or to the driver of any other apparatus whose duty it is to attend fire alarms.
- Section 6. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days or by both fine and imprisonment, within the discretion of the court. Each day any violation of any provision of this ordinance shall continue, constitutes a separate offense.
